Unless waived by the Chairman, the deadline for submittal of proposed amendments and handouts is 12 p.m. on the business day before the meeting. An electronic copy of any proposed amendment or handout must be submitted to email address <u>AsmCL@asm.state.nv.us</u> AND 20 paper copies must be delivered to the Committee Manager, Leslie Danihel, in Room 4108, prior to the 12 p.m. deadline. Handouts and proposed amendments must include the name and contact information of the person submitting the document.

**Please support AB295 because** it is the perfect solution for Nevada's long term desire to have a law that protects access to its thousands of traditional, complementary and alternative health care practitioners such as herbalists, traditional naturopaths, wellness consultants, and many others who are providing great services to health seekers in Nevada.

The new law, already passed in eight other states, would provide a state exemption for those non-invasive complementary and alternative health care practitioners who avoid a specific list of prohibited conduct, such as puncturing the skin or administering prescription drugs or telling people to go off their treatments recommended by their licensed health care professional, and who give out the disclosure information listed in the bill, such as contact information, education and training, and the nature of the services to be rendered.
