Dear Californians,

Today is D-day in CA for voting on SB 277, the vaccine exemption elimination bill. SB 277 is the first bill on the agenda to be heard by the Senate Health Committee today, Wednesday, April 8, at 1:30 pm in Room 4203. Please take a few minutes to contact the members of the committee to tell them to vote NO on SB 277 – use the contact information available [here](#).

If the bill passes, then a precedent will be set for all other states to model next year to push for mandatory vaccinations. The entire country is watching to see what CA does; please do what you can to preserve parental, medical, and religious freedoms in your state.

Should this bill become law, every resident in the state of CA from preschool to the age of 18 will be forced to be vaccinated with every mandated vaccine in order to reside here and to be eligible for any public, private, or home school. Existing law authorizes an exemption from vaccination requirements for medical reasons or because of personal beliefs, if specified forms are submitted to the governing authority. SB 277 would eliminate the exemption from immunization based upon personal beliefs. If SB 277 passes, only a medical exemption would remain, which is usually only issued after a catastrophic adverse vaccine reaction has occurred, and often times, not even then. Without a personal belief exemption, which includes religious exemptions, CA law would infringe on the right to voluntary and informed decision-making about preventative health medical interventions.
