Vermont: Vermont's Assembly and Senate passed HB98 on May 14th, taking away parental rights to decline or modify vaccines for their children with the use of the current exemption available based on personal convictions. The bill is on its way to the Governor's office. **Take Action Here.**

California: California's Senate passed SB277 on May 14th, a bill that would take away parental rights to decline vaccines for their children based on personal and religious beliefs. The bill is on its way to the Assembly. **Take Action Here.**

Mass vaccination policies are made at the state level - where your action to protect your rights are urgently needed now! Defend the right to make informed voluntary decisions about vaccinations.
